South River Water Trail Simply Amazing Possibilities

Today, surrounding communities are reaping the benefits of much improved water quality in the South River thanks to hundreds of millions of dollars in court mandated wastewater infrastructure improvements.

This huge investment is being made to ensure that the river is safe for recreational use and functions as suitable and useful wildlife habitat. One way to measure the return on this investment in cleaner water is greater use and enjoyment of the river and its surrounding ecosystem.

How can we continue to maximize this investment and boost the value and help secure the future of the South River at the same time? We can do what other communities across the state are doing and lay the groundwork and build the organizational structure needed for the South River Water Trail.

The South River Water Trail would be the water equivalent of a hiking trail that provides access points for recreational activities such as canoeing, kayaking, paddling, picnicking, and bird watching as well as provide access to educational, scenic, cultural, and historic sites along or in close proximity to the river. These activities will bring people into the area which will in turn attract businesses, stimulating economic development.

Currently, under the water trail banner, watershed groups in partnership with communities and municipalities all across the state are touting and realizing the value of their rivers and waterways. Below are some of Georgia's established water trails.

There are several other factors that lend support for the creation of the South River Water Trail. First, Americans want access to their rivers, lakes, and streams (America's Great Outdoors Initiative, 2010). Since

most people live in urban areas, this desire for access must also be concentrated in these areas. Yet, stream revitalization remains relatively lacking in urban areas where people are most concentrated (Moran, 2010). The South River Water Trail will open the door for people to enjoy this scarce, valuable, and underutilized natural amenity located right in their own community.

Second, we all know that location is the key to higher property values. Driven by desirability, most people would like to live near water, and scarcity, the amount of waterfront property is very limited, one of the largest influences on the value of a piece of property is its proximity to water. Whether located near an ocean, lake, or river, people pay more for waterfront property. With the amenities and other improvements that the South River Water Trail will bring, there is the potential for increased property values near the river.

Finally, communities throughout Georgia are realizing the economic benefit of promoting their rivers and waterways. The South River Water Trail would become a part of the outdoor recreation industry that provides 6.1 million American jobs, \$39.9 billion in federal tax revenue, and \$39.7 billion in state/local tax revenue. In Georgia, approximately 1 million paddlers participate in the sport. More than \$23 million dollars is spent in the state on recreation. Source: Broad River Watershed Association.

The South River Water Trail will offer recreation, education, scenic, cultural, and historic venues, economic development opportunities, and the possibility of increased property values for homeowners.

The investment in better water quality has been made and is paying dividends through increased use and support for the river. The work required to make the South River Water Trail a reality can be the catalyst that keeps this momentum going.
